#### **GENERAL DIRECTIVES**

Admission and withdrawals

- 1. Admissions open for both boys and girls. It is restricted by certain policies of the management and by the condition of age, ability and conduct of the candidate.
- 2. While seeking admission the following documents are to be produced.
  - a. Transfer Certificate
  - b. Birth Certificate
  - c. Community Certificate (for SC/ST/ Backward only)
  - d. Aadhaar (Copy)
- 3. Applications for admission should be made on the prescribed form by parents or guardians who will be responsible to the head of the school for the pupils, conduct, deportment, punctuality, regular attendance, progress in school and payment of fees.
- 4. The principal reserves the right of refusing continued studies if any pupils whose conduct is found not satisfactory or who is not benefitting by his/ her study in this school.

### ATTENDANCE

- 1. As regular attendance is an important element for successful work; no student should absent himself/herself from class and school programs without sufficient reason.
- 2. Attendance on the reopening and closing days is compulsory. Special permission is required in for exceptional cases.
- 3. In case of serious illness the Principal must be informed on time, and leave application should be accompanied by a doctor's certificate. Long absence from the school without prior intimation will be viewed seriously. They are liable to be removed from the roll. Leave record should be duely filled by the parent/guardian.
- 4. Pupils will not be allowed to leave the school during the working hours. In case of emergency the parent or the guardian should seek permission from the Principal personally.

- 5. Pupils who come late should obtain the signature of the class teacher in the Late Record" Sheet of the school diary.
- 6. Every student must take part in Physical education and other co-curricular activities unless rendered medically unfit or exempted by the Principal.

#### **EVALUATION AND PROMOTION**

CBSE has restored board examination for class X and revised assessment structure and examination from academic year 2017-2018 onwards. This new scheme will bring the uniformity in the system of assessment and examination for class IX Uniform pattern of assessment, examination pattern will be implemented in upper primary stage onwards. The scheme for classes VI-VIII has been designed on term basis with gradual increase in the learning assessment as the students move forward. This would prepare the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and face the challenge of class X board examination and ensure the 'quality of education'.

#### COUNSELLING

Counselling is possible only in a tension and fear free atmo sphere. A counselling centre is functioning at Mary Matha to reduce the tension and fear of students. The Health Wellness Teacher is in charge of the counselling centre and students and parents can avail of the services of the counsellor whenever it is necessary.

#### LIBRARY RULES

#### "Reading makes a perfect man"

- 1. All students are members of the school library.
- 2. Strict silence should be observed in the library at all times.
- 3. Students should not bring any book of their own into the library except their note books and a pen or pencil. A very short summary of the book read must be written in the library note book.

"In learning you will teach, and in teaching you will learn."

- 4. Books will be issued to students during the library periods mentioned in the time table.
- Any book lost must be replaced or duly compensated for. Fine will be levied for damage to books borrowed.
- 6. Reference books and other books like the Dictionary and Encyclopedia etc., cannot be taken home. They are to be read only with in the library.
- 7. Books should be returned on or before the due date indicated on them without fail.
- 8. No book, magazine or newspaper should be taken out without the permission of the Librarian.

#### **RULES FOR LABORATORY**

- 1. Silence should be observed while doing practical in the laboratory
- 2. The instructions given by the teacher must be followed.
- 3. Students will be responsible for any breakage or loss of the apparatus which is used in the experiment. Every breakage or loss should immediately be reported to the teacher.
- 4. Students shall bring to laboratory proper record books and observation note books and shall record all observations immediately after the experiments are performed.
- 5. Students will hand over the chemicals and apparatus taken for the experiments to the teacher when the experiment is over. They shall not take out or bring in any chemicals or instruments to the laboratory.
- 6. Students shall strictly adhere to safety rules & regulations while in laboratory.

#### SUGGESTIONS TO PARENTS

1. Parents are requested to co-operate with the school authorities by enforcing regularity and discipline, by ensuring that the children prepare their lessons and by remitting the fees on scheduled dates. They are also expected to see that their children attend school in the prescribed dress and with the required books.

- 2. Parent-Teacher meetings are conducted for all classes sepa rately. Parents will be invited individually as and when it is found necessary.
- 3. All official matters will be transacted only in the school and during office hours.
- 4. Parents are encouraged to give positive suggestions for the improvement of academic standard. All dues must be cleared before a student is admitted to the terminal and final examination.
- 5. Parents shall see the teacher concerned with prior permission of the Principal, from time to time during visiting hours. So that they can have the first hand knowledge of the progress and conduct of the child.
- 6. Parents are requested not to enter the children's class rooms without permission.
- 7. Parents are requested to refrain from asking for special leave to attend wedding of other than the child's own brother or sister or for religious ceremonies, social functions and domestic celebrations as leave for such purpose, is normally not granted during term time.
- 8. Improper conduct reflecting character, persistence, irregularity, continued neglect of studies, disobedience, insubordination and disrespect towards any staff member, mal practice at tests and examinations, immoral behaviour and other serious intentional offences are punishable by expulsion.
- 9. Parents are always welcome to the school to check the progress of their children. But they are not allowed to meet their children or meet the teacher during school hours without the permission of the Principal.
- 10. Lunch should be provided to children only in boxes along with a towel for keeping the lunch place of every student tidy. Excess food if any should be taken back home. Parent shall send food neither in plantain leaf nor in plastic sheets.

- 11. Please, remember that a disciplined child at home will be a disciplined child at school also. Take interest in their tests, assignments, and their daily work and also in their co-curricular activities.
- 12. A fine of Rs. 25/- will be levied from the indisciplined students. The amount shall be transferred to charity fund.
- 13. Entrusting a pupil to the school implies that parents, agree to stand by the rules and regulations of the school and they should see that children also abide by the school regulations.
- 14. All should be habitually CLEAN AND NEATLY DRESSED. The school uniform is to be worn on all school days. A student who is solvently dressed may not be permitted into the class room or may even be sent home.

#### **DISCIPLINARY RULES**

- 1. All students come under school rules from the beginning of the journey to school until the end of their journey back home.
- 2. Classes start at 9.30 a.m. and end at 3.30 p.m. Students must reach the school by 9.10 a.m. Attendance at school assembly is compulsory. Those who come before 9.10 a.m. should sit in the class and study quietly.
- 3. At the first sound of warning bell all STOP STILL wherever they may be. At the second bell all proceed briskly in SILENCE for the assembly or classroom as the case may be.
- 4. Students are expected to speak English in the school premises.
- 5. If at the beginning of the period no teacher has arrived, class leader will see that order and silence are maintained in the class room. If after five minutes the teacher has not arrived, the leader should send his/her assistant to inform the Principal/ office about it.
- 6. All pupils should, at all times maintain a high standard of manners, in there words and deeds.
- 7. Pupils should, always be dressed in the Prescribed school uniform or sports uniform, wherever applicable, in the school.
- 8. Pupil should reach the school before the first bell. No late coming

is tolerated. The students who reach the school campus early, should enter their classroom and spend their time in silent study, till the warning bell at 9.15 am.

- 9. Students shall greet the teachers, elders and companions respectfully when they meet them any day for the first time. They should show sign of good manners and culture in conversation saying 'thank you' 'please' 'excuse me' 'yes teacher' etc. according to the occasion,
- 10. Students shall be responsible for the safe custody of their belongings. As a precautionary measure, it is suggested that they have their names inscribed on articles like tiffin carriers, umbrellas, school bags, pencil box etc. The school authorities will not be responsible for the loss of article of students.
- 11. Lost articles must be claimed from school office within a week, after which period, unclaimed articles will be disposed off. Any damage caused to the property of the school must be made good.
- 12. Classrooms and the school premises shall be kept neat and tidy. All waste materials must be put in the proper receptacle. Students must make a point of picking up and disposing of litter.

#### SCHOOL BUS

- Pupil should wait for the school bus in their respective collecting centres on the road side at least five minutes earlier. The bus pass is to be brought to bus daily. NO ONE IS ALLOWED TO TRAVEL ON THE SCHOOL BUS WITHOUT THE BUS PASS. Loss of bus pass is to be reported promptly to the office. If any body is found missing at the time of departure of the bus he/she will be responsible for it.
- 2. No singing or shouting or throwing articles out of the bus or making comments on the people outside is allowed in the school bus. Strong and prompt disciplinary action will be taken against those pupils who misbehave in the school bus.
- 3. Pupils who fail to remit the bus fare in due time will not be allowed to travel in bus. Bus charges should be paid in advance.

- 4. The school bus service will be as usual-in the morning and evening even on the examination days. Children must enter the bus in queue system.
- 5. The school bus facility or its discontinuance is not admissible for any part of a term.
- 6. One month's notice in writing shall be given for discontinuance of bus facility. Request for change of boarding points shall be made in writing at least 2 weeks in advance
- 7. Commuting by school bus is an occasion for the pupils to cultivate good habit like patience, forbearance, tolerance, sympathy, team spirit, co-operation and consideration for others.
- 8. Gentlemanly and exemplary behavior is expected of the students in the bus and the boarding points where they wait for the bus.
- 9. Any student found using foul language or caught fighting in the bus shall be suspended from using the school transport. In order to maintain order and discipline in the bus, students are to co-operate with the conductor.
- 10. An amount equal to two months bus fee is to be paid in the beginning as advance. Those who discontinue the school bus facility will lose the advance.

#### AMMENDMENT OF RULES

The management / Principal has the right to introduce new rules amend or change these rules and regulations in case of exigencies and in furtherance of the aims and objectives of the managing society and the school as and when necessity arises.

#### SCHOOL FEES

The Fees shall be paid in school - Full or 3 installment.

Ist Term : June - August (Last date June 30)

II<sup>nd</sup> Term : September - November (Last date September 30)

III<sup>rd</sup> Term : December - March (Last date January 30)

First Installment of fees shall be remitted before receiving the Text book. All other installments should be remitted before the  $5^{th}$  of the first month of the quarter.

Students will be permitted to sit for the examination only if the dues have been cleared and a 'No Dues' Certificate has been obtained prior to the commencement of the examinations.

Parents must keep all the fee receipts issued to them and produce them as proof of payment, if needed.

- 8. Revise the previous portions in weekends.
- 9. Writing and studying help to improve hand writing, spelling memory etc.
- 10. Fix the equations, formulas, definitions etc. beside your study table.
- 11. Keep healthy and energetic body and fresh brain to help to concentrate well. Practice Yoga.
- 12. Do the assignments neatly and properly.
- 13. Watch only educative T. V. programmes.
- 14. Give short intervals while studying.

Eg.:- When you study for a longtime, you can give short intervals of 5 minutes which regreshes your mind and brain.

- 15. Over eating reduces our concentration. Try to avoid it.
